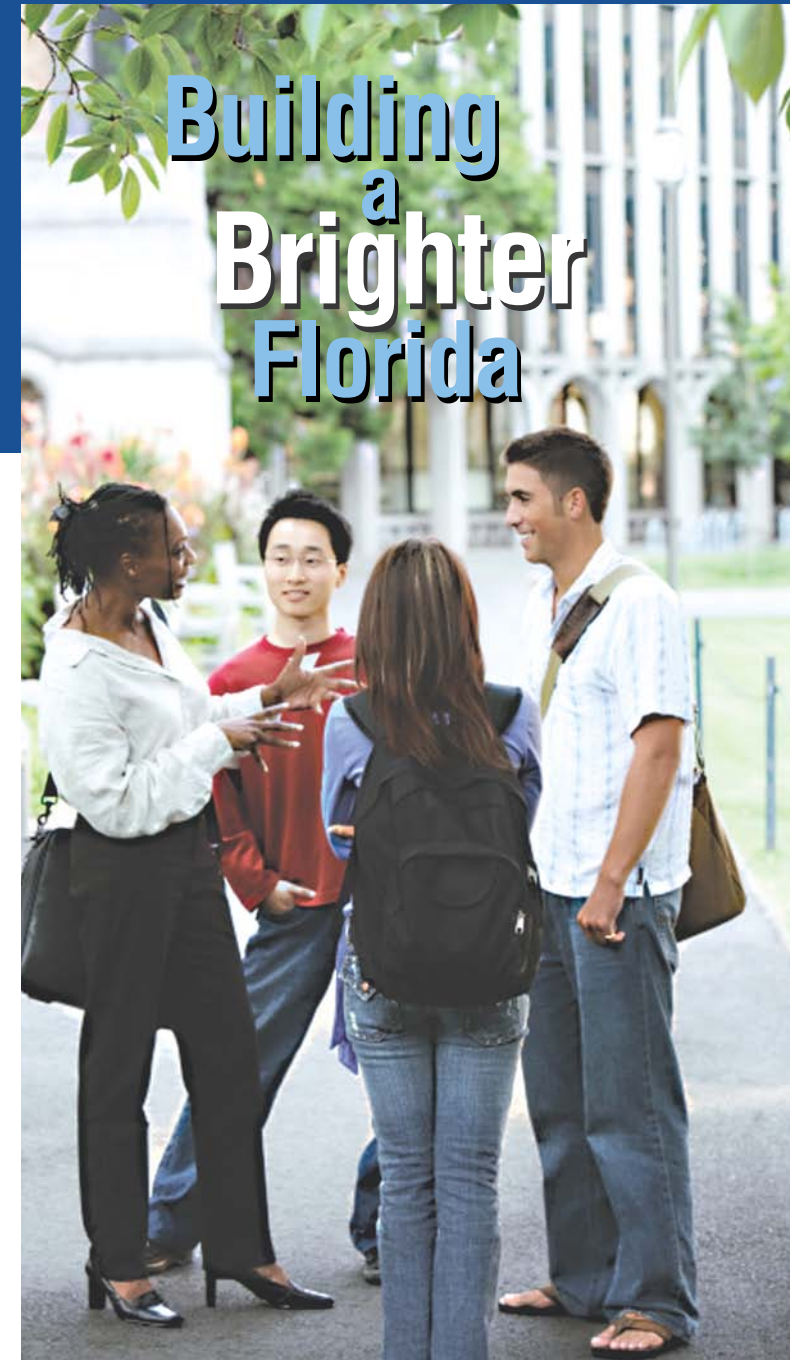

Who We Are

The Independent Colleges & Universities of Florida (ICUF) is a diverse association of 28 private, educational institutions. ICUF institutions are non-profits, Florida-based and (like Florida's public universities and community colleges) accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges & Schools (SACS).

These institutions are funded in part through student tuition that can be paid using: federal loans; federal Pell Grants; Florida Bright Futures Scholarships and other merit scholarships; pre-paid tuition plans; need-based assistance; institution awards; scholarships from the Florida Independent College Fund; and the Florida Resident Access Grant (FRAG). ICUF institutions award financial aid to 85% of their students. Independent colleges or universities offer access to opportunity.

The Three A's

- Available** Nearly 200 sites in Florida with degree programs at 20 community colleges. More than 120,000 degree-seeking students including nearly 56% Florida residents.
- Affordable** Eighty-five percent of ICUF students get financial aid averaging more than \$11,000, including Bright Futures, FRAG, federal and state aid and institutional scholarships.
- Acclaimed** All ICUF institutions are SACs accredited and award 26% of Florida's Bachelor Degrees and nearly 55% of Florida's First Professional Degrees.

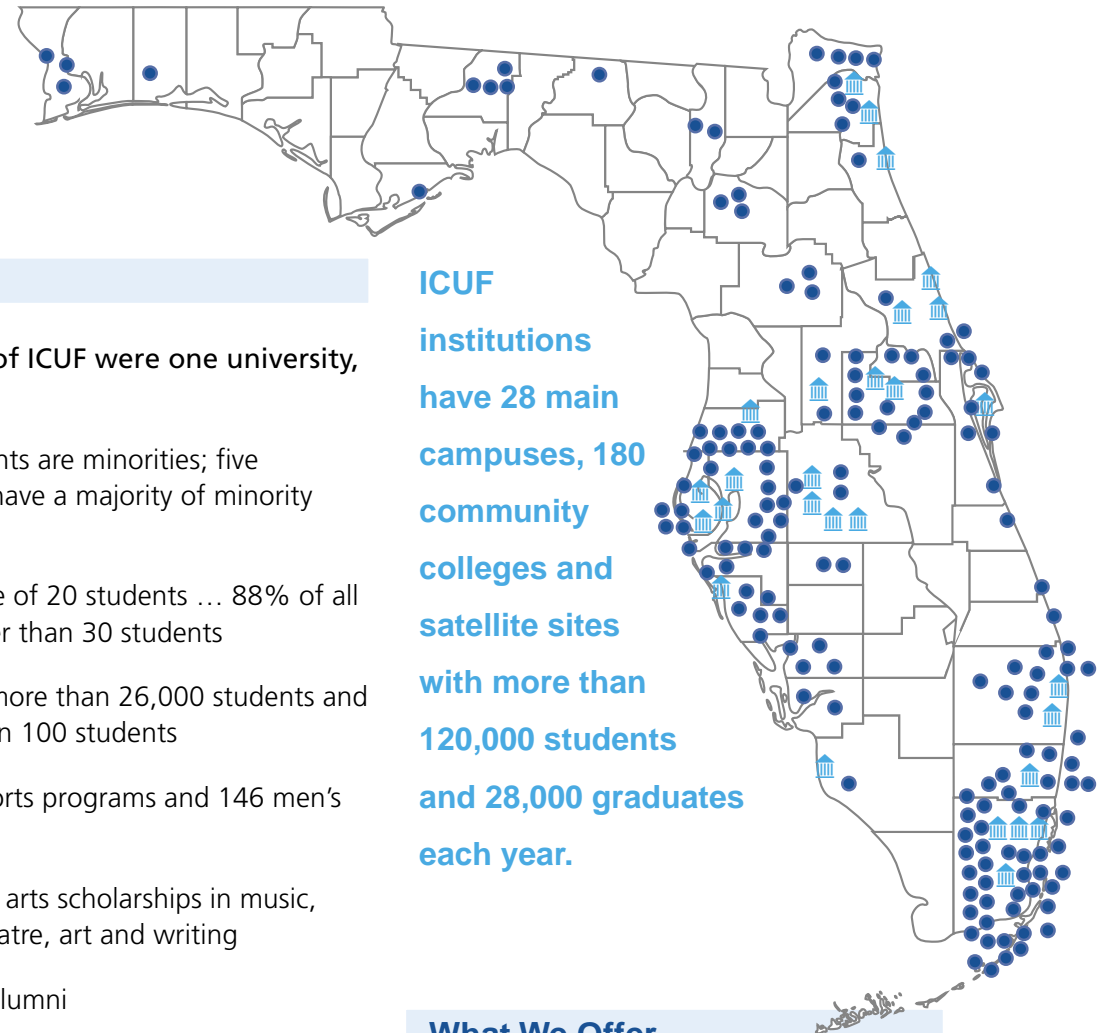
Who We Serve

If the 28 members of ICUF were one university, it would have:

- 44% of its students are minorities; five institutions that have a majority of minority students
- Average class size of 20 students ... 88% of all classes with fewer than 30 students
- Campuses with more than 26,000 students and one with less than 100 students
- 159 women's sports programs and 146 men's sports programs
- More than 2,000 arts scholarships in music, voice, dance, theatre, art and writing
- Nearly 600,000 alumni
